- ◆ Water source with garden hose and nozzle is required, a "4A" extinguisher is acceptable.
- ◆ All open fires must be located a minimum distance of 25 feet from any structure.
- ◆ Fires contained in an approved burner located not less than 15 feet from any structure.
- ◆ An adult must be in attendance at all times.
- ◆ Fire must be extinguished upon completion of the recreational activity.
- ◆ Subject to Northwest Air Pollution Regulations.
- ◆ **Permit must be present on site during burning.**

Fire shall not contain prohibited materials i.e., garbage, dead animals, asphalt, petroleum products, paints, rubber products, plastics, paper, cardboard, treated wood, construction debris, metal or any other substance other than approved material (charcoal, firewood or LPG), which when burned releases toxic emissions, dense smoke, or odors.

No burning shall occur during a "No Burn Day" as designated by the NWAPA or Anacortes Fire Department due to a forecast or existence of impaired air quality or other environmental conditions.

Firewood is defined by Anacortes Fire Department to be natural vegetation cut into sticks of two inches or larger in diameter.

RECREATIONAL FIRE PERMIT GUIDELINES

1. All recreational fires require a written permit.
2. Recreational fires are comprised of either 2'x3' open cooking fires or approved wood burning BBQ's.
3. Only firewood is allowed to be burned. Firewood is defined by Anacortes Fire Department to be natural vegetation cut into sticks of two inches or larger in diameter. All smaller branches, grass and leaves are to be disposed of via recycling or composting and are considered to be yard debris and not legal to burn.
4. Permits for recreational fires are valid for 1 year from the time of issuance.
5. All recreational fires except those in approved BBQ's shall be located 25 feet or more from combustible structures or material. Approved BBQ's shall be 15 feet or more from buildings.

Approved BBQ's are made of non-combustible material. Burn barrels are not an approved barbecue. Manufactured units such as Weber, Char-broil, etc., are approved if used per manufacture's instructions.

6. A garden hose, shovel and adult shall be present while the fire is burning.
7. All fires shall be fully extinguished prior to being abandoned.

MARINA BARBECUES

Permits are required for use of barbecues at all marinas within the City of Anacortes. Use is subject to the following requirements:

1. Use of barbecues on the pier, float, dock or wharf proper is **prohibited**.
2. Only commercially produced barbecues, braziers or similar devices should be used.
3. A Coast Guard approved portable extinguisher is required, minimum size – 1A10BC. (See Underwriter's Laboratory Label.)
4. **Do not use** BBQ's near a fuel tank, tank ventilation, engine compartment or compartment ventilation, especially below the level of the opening; fuel vapors are heavier than air and may integrate toward to open flame BBQ.
